Adopt a Barn Cat Non-Toxic Pest Control and Save a Life

Feral cats are unsocialized cats who were born outside without a lot of human contact. While these kitties do not want to curl up on your lap, they still love life and want a place to call home. Once in an animal control shelter, most feral cats are put down because they would not make a good house pet. But **you can adopt one or more cats to live outside on your property and save their lives!**

Additionally, **for the price of daily cat food, they will keep your out-buildings or stable rodent free.**

We have several beautiful, healthy, neutered and vaccinated feral cats that are looking for outdoor homes with a barn, shed, or other shelter.
