
Acupuncture



- The belief that disease is the result of Chi imbalance
- Chi is the energy that flows through the pathways of energy flow, known as the meridians
- Stimulating Acupoints along meridians helps to improve circulation, reset the pain cycle, and stimulates the body's natural ability to heal.











Acupuncture: Used to Treat Many Problems



Musculoskeletal conditions

- Sore back, neck pain, lameness, etc.
- Neurological disorders
- Respiratory problems
- Gastrointestinal conditions
- Colic, ulcers, etc.




Acupuncture works in many aspects because it stimulates the release of natural pain killers such as (but not limited to) endorphins, encephalin, and serotonin.





Acupuncture Points and Meridians



- Acupoints are specific points that govern energy flow
- There are 12 main meridians throughout the body
- lung, pericardium, heart, large intestine, triple heater, small intestine, urinary bladder, stomach, liver, spleen kidney & gallbladder



Acupoint Treatment



- Needle insertion
- Injection of a liquid known as aquapuncture
- Electrical stimulation
- Heat or Moxibustion
- Laser
- Pressure



Treatments 1-3 times per week or quarterly for maintenance. Treatments by veterinarians only



Chiropractic



- Prevents and treats back, neck and joint pain
- Improves the immune system
- Improves energy and performance
- Hands on healing method to 'adjust' the spine
- Adjustments aid in restoring mobility and alignment to the spine and other joints in the body





Chiropractic



1-3 times per week or quarterly maintenance

Treatments by veterinarians only, or in some states an AVCA certified DC under direct veterinary

supervision
















- Vertebra house the spinal cord
- Horses have 7 cervical vertebra, 18 thoracic vertebra, 6 lumbar vertebra, 5 fused sacral vertebra, and variable numbers of coccygeal vertebra
- There are joints between each vertebra
- Subluxation occurs when the joints are fixated or misaligned
- Subluxation leads to soreness and nerve impingement
- Adjustment corrects the Subluxation






Massage



Loosen tight muscles, joints and tendons
Break down scar tissue
Improve lymphatic drainage and blood flow

There are a number of different types and methods

- Rolfing
- TTouch
- Etc.





SCENAR



- Self Controlled Electro/Neuro Adaptive Regulation
- Electro- stimulation type device
- Excels at treating pain management

 Releases endorphins, resents the pain cycle and stimulates the body's innate ability to heal


















Estim and Tens





- Improves blood flow
- Stimulates the innate ability to heal
- Resets the pain cycle





Cold Laser

- Improves blood flow
- Relieves pain
- Aids in healing
- Low level Laser with light-emitting diodes







Other Similar Therapies

- Infrared heat therapy- deeply penetrating heat that is soothing
- Magnet therapy- improves blood flow and oxygenation
- Therapeutic Ultrasound- blood flow and healing
- Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy- oxygen three times the normal atmospheric pressure- infections, injury healing
- Pulsed Electromagnetic Field circulation and cellular balance





Yoga for Horses

- Horses should be warmed up prior to stretching
- Never force the stretch
- Follow proper technique
- Take a deep breath
- Repeat at least 3 times per week


