

The ASPCA Equine Fund provides grants to U.S. nonprofit equine welfare organizations and other animal welfare organizations that care for horses, mules, donkeys and ponies – both wild and domestic – in alignment with our efforts to protect all equines. The ASPCA Equine Fund grants program seeks to award equine organizations which strive to achieve best practices, including maintenance of updated websites and robust fundraising practices, as well as excellent animal care. Unsolicited grants are generally awarded in amounts from \$500-\$4,000 and do not exceed 10% of an organization's current annual





unsolicited grant proposals by mail, email, or in any format other than through this site.
