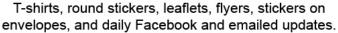

Every supporter may vote once per day.

Note: it doesn't matter how many email addresses a person has

— she or he can only vote once daily.





How Do You Vote?

Q: Can voters use their iPad or smartphone?

A: Yes, you can vote by computer, smartphone or iPad.

Q: Can voters use their phone to vote via call or text?

A: Voting by text message, phone call, or email is not possible
