Category 1: Medications	• Fluorouracil (5-FU) Cream • Fluoroquinolone antibiotics • Lamotrigine • Metronidazole • Amphetamines • Diphenhydramine	• Procaine Penicillin G • Ivermectin • Isoniazid • Ibuprofen • Phenylbutazone • Vilazodone	• Phenylpropanolamine • Procaine Penicillin G • 5-hydroxytryptophan (5-HTP) • Any medications with the potential to cause hypoglycemia (such as sulfonylureas)
