

Top 10 Toxins of 2015



OTC Items

With the increasing number of vitamins, herbal and joint supplements sold over the counter, there are lots more dangers for pet exposures.



Insecticides

The APCC commonly sees exposure to products used in the house, in the yard and on pets.



Household Items

Commonly used items in homes such as paint,

fire logs and cleaning supplies can be very hazardous.



Chocolate

Calls about chocolate exposures were increased in 2015, with the APCC averaging one call about chocolate every 39 minutes.



Rodenticides

These are often grainbased and very appealing to pets. Bromethalin, a neurotoxin, is becoming much more common.



Human Prescriptions

These medications were barely edged out of their traditional No.1 spot on the

APCC's list of top yearly toxin calls.



People Food

Human food and drink are often readily accessible—and very appealing—to pets. Xylitol and alcohol

are common and serious exposures.



Veterinary Products

Many pet medications are in the form of chewable

tablets—and that means pets may take the entire prescription at once if they have access.



Plants

Do the plants in your home and outside landscaping pose any danger to pets?



Garden Products

Pets often get into herbicides and fungicides that are left in the garage, shed or yard.
