







Why "Clean Water?"






Runoff causes problems!

- Misused chemicals






1. Put native plants to work



A native plant is one that's here naturally & has not been introduced.





Native plants offer lots benefits over non-natives

- Disease tolerant
- Better adapted to our climate
- Require less care, no watering & no pesticides
- Cost less
- Very attractive
- Offer food & shelter to a variety of native animals





Jobs around a horse property that native plants can do:





- Mud reduction
- Dust barriers
- Visual screens & buffers between neighbors
- Summer shade & winter sun for horses
- Summer cooling of buildings
- Erosion control
- Encourage beneficial wildlife that you want (to eat bugs or rodents, serenade us, entertain us, etc.)










Building a Nestbox



Materials

- One 1x6" x 6' rough cedar board
- Eighteen 1-1/4" outdoor wood screws or # 7 galvanized nails
- Wire to keep side door shut





3. Least toxic rodent control













BARN OWL THE PERFECT MOUSETRAP



This graceful, medium sized owl can be found on every continent except Antarctica. The Barn Owls' ability for silent flight, their tendency to inhabit abandoned buildings and their unique loud, rasping, high-pitched hiss or scream, has earned this bird names such as Ghost Owl and Spirit Owl.



Exclusively nocturnal (night time), Barn Owls use their exceptional hearing to hunt in total darkness with complete accuracy. Probably the most economically beneficial owl in the world due to its eating habits, the Barn Owl has long helpe farmers control rodent populations. A Barn Owl family of two adults and six owlets can eat more than 1,000 rodents during a three-month period

The Barn Owl is an endangered species in Illinois and much of the Midwest. Loss of nesting and hunting habitat along with pesticides has led to severe population declines





















4. Least toxic weed control

Practice good pasture management

- Establish a sacrifice area
- Never graze below 3-4"
- Practice rotational grazing
- Keep horses off winter pastures





Least toxic weed control




- Hand remove
- Weed burner
- Spot spray using the appropriate herbicide at the recommended time of the year
- Integrated Pest
 Management













Least toxic weed control



- IPM method using beneficial insects
- Ex: Cinnabar moth
 - Tansy Ragwort





Horticultural vinegar







Distilled White Vinegar



Herbicides



- Choose the appropriate herbicide
- Use at the right time of year/plant growth
- Mix according to instructions
- Spot spray
- Don't spray when windy or going to rain









- Zeolite products
- Beneficial microbial sprays
