Keep Your Equines Away from These Trees and Shrubs

Equine are commonly exposed to toxic trees and shrubs. Exposures can occur in a pasture, when branches fall during storms, when mixed in their bedding, when out on a ride, when hitched out of their pasture and, sometimes, these plants can make their way into hay bales on accident. To keep your equine safe, make sure you keep the following toxic trees and shrubs out of reach.

Toxic Trees

Black Walnut

Juglans nigra can cause laminitis (founder)

Red Maple

Acer rubrum can cause kidney issues

Oak

Quercus spp can cause gastrointestinal issues (colic)

Oleander

Nerium oleander can cause cardiac issues

Japanese Yew
