Five Freedoms

 Freedom from hunger and thirst



- Freedom from discomfort
- Freedom from pain, injury or disease
- Freedom to express normal behavior
- Freedom from fear and distress



SAWA Best Practice Requirements

- ✓ Comfortable resting area
- ✓ Hiding spot (especially cats and fearful animals)
- √ Things to chew (dogs, cats)
- ✓ Scratching surfaces (cats)
- ✓ At least one toy, rotated daily
- ✓ Daily social interaction
- ✓ Daily sensory enrichment
- ✓ Daily mental stimulation
- √ Regular physical exercise
- ✓ Exposure to enjoyable novelty





Enrichment Types

- Enclosure enhancements
- Socialization opportunities
- Cognitive enrichment
- Exposure to enjoyable novelty
- Feeding enrichment
- Physical exercise
- Sensory stimulation





The Best Enrichments

- Cheap or free

- Disposable, edible or disinfectable










