We're on hand to talk you through your budgeting plan from an early stage, ensuring that, once at full capacity, your clinic is self-sustaining. We've planned many a budget with a wide variety of options, so we have a wealth of advice and resources for you on this front.

FLOOR PLAN REVIEW

We can review your clinic floor plan and provide advice for optimal clinic flow, patient safety, and staff efficiency.

BETTER PRICING ON SUPPLIES

As an NSNRT clinic, you belong to a group of professionals who benefit from group discounts on equipment and supplies. We liaise with the providers annually to negotiate the best deals and save you time and money!

EQUIPMENT GRANTS

The ASPCA offers grant opportunities to purchase necessary clinic equipment, consumables, and to help with travel costs for your team to train in Asheville. The program director guiding you will advise you of these opportunities during the application process.

ASHEVILLE TRAINING

Our comprehensive guidance culminates when the staff of your new clinic visits Asheville for an intensive one-week, hands-on learning experience. They will be trained by members of our staff, who are dedicated for that period of time exclusively to training you. The medical staff on your team will be in surgery each day. The administrative staff will follow a separate training track.

The entire team will come together again at the end of the day for classroom sessions in topics such as CPR, animal handling, anesthesia, and action planning. Download a typical RVT schedule at:

ONSITE TRAINING

Following the training in Asheville, we will send a team to your clinic for one week, which usually coincides with your opening day. The team typically consists of two staff members: a veterinarian and a veterinary assistant. ASPCA Spay/Neuter Alliance pays the salaries and travel expenses to send our team to your clinic.

CONSULTATION VISIT

NSNRT members have the option of requesting an additional two-day consultation visit within six months of their initial Asheville training (at the member's expense). This consultation visit is designed to help you fine-tune your clinic, working on flow, budgeting, and any other issues that may have arisen during your first months of business. Please note, however, that this follow-up visit is not intended to provide training for new staff members.
